Praying Through Acts 6:1-8 International Bible Lesson L.G. Parkhurst, Jr.

Dear Heavenly Father, we thank You that Your Holy Spirit worked through good and faithful disciples in the creation of the Church. We thank You that Hellenistic Jews and Hebraic Jews came to faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. We thank You for inspiring acts of charity in behalf of those most needy, widows and orphans. Lord Jesus, we thank You for the example the first deacons in the Church set for all who would follow You. We thank You especially for Stephen who died as a martyr and for Philip who shared the gospel with Jews and Gentiles alike. We pray that by Your grace we would have the courage and trust in You that we need to share the gospel as they did. By Your grace, help us be as obedient to the faith as the first Christians, and help us lead others to love and obey You as Your faithful disciples. In Your Name, we pray. Amen.

You might like to close your class with the above prayer as a way of beginning to teach your class how they too can pray through the Bible. First, you might like to teach your class how to pray through the *International Bible Lessons* each week. [Perhaps some of them would learn how to pray through portions of the Bible during their daily Bible reading and quiet time.] Second, a week in advance, perhaps some of your students would like to write their own "Prayer Through the Bible" using the International Bible Lesson scripture text and read their prayer at the close of class. Third, eventually, your students will be able to pray through the Bible without needing to write their prayer in advance before they pray at the end of class.
