### Praying Through James 5:7-12

Please help us refrain from judging others from our point of view and grant us the love and wisdom to share the teachings of the Bible with others. As we consider the prophets, Jesus, James, Paul, and the other apostles, please grant us the ability to follow their examples. Indeed, they spoke and taught in Your Name as You led them, and sometimes they paid their ultimate price for their faithfulness. Grant us the endurance of Job, knowing how You commended Job at the end of his suffering and trials. We know that in all things You demonstrate Your true character, Your compassion, and Your mercy. Help us depend entirely on You and glorify Your Name in every situation before a world where people need to know You. In Jesus' Name we pray. Amen.

**Please Note:** I first learned about “Praying Through the Bible” from Edith Schaeffer, the wife of Francis Schaeffer. You might like to close your class with the above prayer as a way of beginning to teach your class how they too can pray through the Bible. Third, eventually, your students will be able to pray through the Bible without needing to write their prayer in advance before they pray at the end of class.
