Class Starter or Closer Discussion Questions

1. Zealous Saul

- Why did Saul believe he was serving God while he was persecuting Christians?
- How can sincere people sometimes be mistaken about what God wants?

2. Meeting Jesus

- Why do you think Jesus asked, “Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?” instead of simply condemning him?
- How can an encounter with Jesus completely change the direction of a person's life?

3. Learning to Obey

- After Saul asked, “Who are you, Lord?” his next question was, “What shall I do, Lord?”
- Why are these two questions important for anyone who wants to follow Jesus?

4. A New Mission

- God chose Saul to become a witness of what he had seen and heard.
- What does it mean to be a witness for Jesus today, even if we have not seen Him as Paul did?

5. Your Journey

- Paul's life changed because he met the risen Jesus and obeyed Him.
- What part of Paul's journey speaks to you the most: his zeal, his encounter with Jesus, his obedience, or his new purpose? Why?
